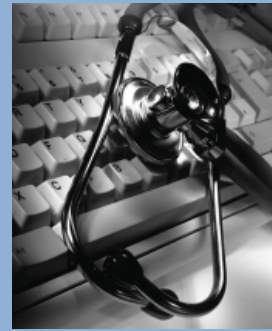

About the Course
